A.General Information

A1. Campus Facility

The campus of the Hong Kong International Aviation Academy ("the Academy") is strategically located at Hong Kong International Airport ("HKIA"). The Academy offers a wide range of aviation training to the airport community and members of the general public interested in the aviation industry.

For more details about our training facilities, please refer to Appendix 1. Most of the training courses listed on our website are held at our HKIA Community Building ("HKIACmu") or HKIA Commercial Building ("HKIACOM") facilities.

HKIACmu and HKIACOM can be accessed from HKIA Terminal 1 or Ground Transportation Centre (GTC).

A2. Transportation Choices

There are plenty of ways to travel to and from the Academy. The Airport Express links HKIA directly to Hong Kong's Central business district, buses connect the airport with major areas of Hong Kong, and taxis provide a convenient additional option. There are also hotel limousines that can take those visiting Hong Kong directly to their hotels.

A2.1 Airport Express

The Airport Express takes passengers to Central in just 24 minutes, the fastest and most convenient route between the Airport and the city.

A2.2 Airport Buses

HKIA is well served by public buses, which take passengers to and from most parts of Hong Kong. Comfortable and relatively inexpensive, they offer a convenient transport option. Bus service to the city is available 24 hours a day.

A2.3 Taxis

Taxis offer a fast and flexible way to get to and from HKIA. You can pick up a taxi at the Taxi Station, which can be reached via the left-side ramp outside the T1 Arrivals Hall.

Taxis in Hong Kong are colour-coded according to their operating areas. Separate queues are designated for different types of taxis:

- Urban taxis (red) serve all destinations throughout Hong Kong, including the airport, except restricted access roads in South Lantau.
- New Territories (N.T.) taxis (green) serve only the New Territories and specific roads in Lantau.
- Lantau taxis (blue) serve all destinations in Lantau and the airport.

A4. Currency, Credit Cards and Banking Services

- The currency unit in Hong Kong is the Hong Kong dollar (HKD).
- International credit cards such as American Express, Diners Club, Visa and MasterCard are usually accepted at major hotels, department stores and restaurants.
- All commercial banks and moneychangers exchange major foreign currencies and usually are open from 0900 to 1700 hours from Monday through Friday.

A5. Useful Information for Staying in Hong Kong

A5.1 Time Zone

The time in Hong Kong is eight hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+8:00).

A5.2 Hong Kong Weather

Hong Kong's climate is sub-tropical, tending towards temperate for nearly half the year. There are pleasant breezes, plenty of sunshine, and comfortable temperatures during November and December. January and February are cloudier and cooler. Urban areas can experience, temperatures are not uncommon below 10°C.

March and April can be very pleasant, although there are occasional spells of high humidity. May to August is hot and humid, with occasional showers and thunderstorms, particularly in the mornings. During these months afternoon temperatures often exceed 31°C; at night, temperatures generally remain around 26°C with high humidity.

B.Code of Conduct

B1. General Classroom Regulations

- No smoking, eating or drinking is allowed inside Academy training classrooms.
 The water dispenser is available in the Lounge area inside the campus. Eating and drinking are only permitted inside the Lounge area.
- No photo-taking or video or sound recording is allowed inside Academy training classrooms without the consent of the Academy.
- Please be considerate and do not cause excessive noise inside the Academy.
 Mobile phones and pagers should be turned OFF or switched to silent mode during class.
- Please do not operate any IT or AV equipment in the classrooms without the presence of Academy instructors or staff.
- Personal belongings should not be left unattended at any time. The Academy will not be responsible for any loss of personal belongings.

- Trainees may enter the classroom 15 minutes before a class commences, and they should leave the classroom as soon as the class is finished. Classrooms will be locked after use.
- A class will be regarded as cancelled if the course instructor is still absent 30
 minutes after the scheduled commencement time. Trainees will be notified of
 the arrangement for make-up classes in due course.

B2. Standards of Behaviour and Attendance

(Applicable for classroom instructional courses and virtual courses)

Trainees should:

- Attend all classes, arriving on time and remaining until dismissed.
- Notify the instructor in advance of the anticipated absence, late arrival or early departure.
- Refrain from disturbing class.
- Turn off and put away cell phones and all other electronic devices unless permission for their use has been otherwise granted.
- Trainees with 80% or above attendance who have satisfactory performance in the course will be awarded a certificate by the Academy.
 (Certain courses may have slightly different attendance requirements. The individual course descriptions will advise these different attendance requirements where applicable notified.)
- Ask questions or share comments at appropriate times.
- Respect the diversity of opinions in your classroom or community. Feel free to disagree if needed, in a courteous manner.
- Respect other participants by giving equal discussion and sharing opportunities.
- Stay on topic.
- Try to be brief and ensure your contribution to discussions.

(Applicable for virtual courses)

Trainees should:

- Ensure a safe, quiet and minimal interference from the nearby environment to avoid disturbance.
- Mute your microphone to avoid background noise.
- Turn your camera on with a personal portrait or according to instructor / course requirement.
- Virtual background is only recommended when the situation is not favourable for the online class.

- Use a chat board for topics related to the course.
- Check previous answers and comments before posting new questions.
- Avoid using slang and texting abbreviations at the chat function.

B3. Dress Code

The dress code for courses at the Academy is smart casual. Dress code requirements may be different for specific activities and events. Trainees are responsible for checking the course syllabus for specific requirements. If a special dress code is required, trainees will be notified in advance.

C. Class, Conference, Examination and Seminar Arrangements During Inclement Weather

When a Tropical Storm Warning or Rainstorm Warning Signal is issued, the following arrangements will apply:

	At or after 4:00 p.m.	Evening sessions with commencement time at or after 6:00 p.m. are suspended.
Typhoon No. 3 or below	Anytime	All sessions will be held as usual
Pre-No. 8 Special Announcement/ Typhoon Signal No. 8 or above	At or after 5:30 a.m.	Morning sessions with commencement time before 2:00 p.m. are suspended.
	At or after 10:30 a.m.	Afternoon sessions with commencement time at or after 2:00 p.m. but before 6:00 p.m. are suspended.
	At or after 4:00 p.m.	Evening sessions with commencement time at or after 6:00 p.m. are suspended.

From Terminal 1 Drop-off Zone (kerbside) to The Academy (Training venue: HKIA Community Building)



Walk through the down ramp from kerbside to enter Terminal 1.



You will arrive check-in hall (level 7).



Go ahead to aisle L, you will see the entrance on your right.



Turn left for the escalator.



Take the escalator and you will arrive level 9.



Entrance is next to Reception(right-hand side).

From Airport Express (AEL) to The Academy (Training venue: HKIA Community Building)



Arrive Airport Station by AEL.



Follow the signage to "Check-in aisle F-L".



Walk through the ramp to enter Terminal 1 check-in hall level 7.



Turn right to find aisle L.




Go ahead to aisle L, you will see the entrance on your right.



Turn left for the escalator.



Take the escalator and you will arrive level 9.



Entrance is next to Reception(right-hand side).

From Airport Ground Transportation Centre (GTC) to The Academy (Training venue: HKIA Commercial Building)



Get off at GTC and heading towards Terminal 1 to Bus Ticket Counter.



You will find the passage to HKIA Commercial Building near Bus Ticket Counter.

From Airport Express (AEL) to The Academy (Training venue: HKIA Commercial Building)



Arrive Airport Station by AEL.



After exit AEL platform, turn left and follow the signage to "Arrival Hall B".



Go straight to the end of the hall, take elevator to 3/F.



Exit the door on 3/F, then turn right.



Go straight pass through the pedestrian crossing at Cheong Tat Road.



Go straight to the Bus Ticket Counter after passing through Cheong Tat Road.
